This book is a history and memoir of Berkeley in the early Sixties. The story is told from the perspective of Jo Freeman, the undergraduate, but put into historical and political context by Jo Freeman, the scholar, 35 years later. It draws heavily on documents created at the time-letters, reports, interviews, memos, newspaper stories, FBI files—but is fleshed out with retrospective analysis. As events unfold, the campus conflicts of the Sixties take on a completely different cast.

Jo FREEMAN has published extensively about feminism, women and politics, social movements, and political parties in scholarly journals, popular magazines, and anthologies. This is her tenth book. She received her B.A from Berkeley, her Ph.D. from the University of Chicago, and her J.D. from New York University School of Law.
